DELIVER HARD NEWS WITHOUT BREAKING TRUST

it should never be careless.**

ABSORB PRESSURE WITHOUT PASSING IT DOWN RAW

**It's easy to let pressure leak out in ways
that create more chaos than quiet.
But the team doesn't need our
unprocessed stress. They need
direction, decisions, and support.**



SIT WITH PEOPLE WHEN YOU CAN'T FIX IT

**Leadership isn't always about fixing.
Sometimes the most important thing
a leader can do is stay present long
enough for someone to know they're
not carrying weight alone.**



CHOOSE PEOPLE WHEN THE PROCESS ISN'T ENOUGH

creates clarity,

more than the process on paper.**

easiest one to document. It's the one
that protects the person, the team, and
the culture you're trying to build.**

always carry weight.**

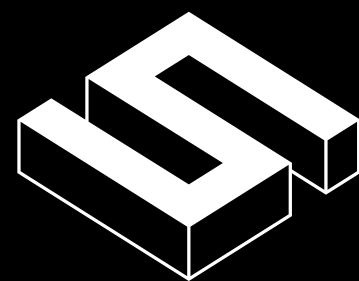
**The work is complex.
